Class Descriptions for BA in Ministry, Ministry to Women Track

Introduction to Women's Ministry (2 hours)

The purpose of this course is to identify the ministry needs of women and gain skills necessary for developing ministries to women through the church. Special attention will be given to the purpose, philosophy, planning, programming, and potential leadership development of women in leadership.

Women's Ministry in the Local Church and Community (2 hours)

The purpose of this course is to identify best practices in developing and leading ministry to women in the local church. Students will analyze practical aspects of women's ministry and understand how they support the overall mission of the local church.

Discipling and Mentoring Women (2 hours)

This course is designed to offer students a broad awareness of discipleship and mentoring among women in the local church. Students will examine historical and current trends in discipleship and mentoring, and engage in personal discipleship with a selected mentor throughout the length of the course.

Biblical Theology of Womanhood (3 hours)

This course offers a comprehensive study of the biblical theology of womanhood, tracing the role, identity, and purpose of women from Genesis to Revelation. Students will explore key concepts that shape biblical womanhood, focusing on such themes as creation, fall, redemption, calling, and community. Through thoughtful study and class discussion, students will be equipped to articulate a Christ-centered vision for womanhood that reflects God's design and redemptive purposes.

Women in Scripture (3 hours)

This course guides students to know and understand the roles of women from Genesis to Revelation. Students will examine selected narratives of women in both the Old and New Testament, developing an understanding of how women were created and helped shape the early church.

Writing Ministry for Women (3 hours)

This course introduces students to developing and writing Bible studies and discipleship resources for women in the local church. Students will examine current resources and develop a unique resource of their own.

Women in Contemporary Context (3 hours)

This course is designed to offer students a broad awareness of contemporary issues, both global and domestic, that are pertinent to women. Students will examine historical and current trends among the needs of women and determine best practices for ministry to women in a contemporary context.

Women's Leadership Development (2 hours)

This course is designed for students to develop an understanding and philosophy of leadership in ministry to women. Student will learn about a variety of leadership philosophies, personal leadership styles, and develop a written philosophy of leadership based on their learning.
